### Tudor House is in a built-up residential area in the Linden region of Gloucester. ÷. *i*τ. Tudor House has a bus stop near which runs every 10 minutes into Gloucester City Centre. *i*τÅ Tudor House is a close to all local amenities including, shops, post office, GP surgery and chemist. \*\* Tudor House is a short walk to Gloucester City Centre, Gloucester Quays and Gloucester Park. 2. Pen Picture of the Premises: Tudor House is a four-bedroom house with a kitchen, one bathroom, one separate toilet, lounge and rear garden. There is a ring doorbell on the front door, a ring camera in the rear garden and driveway which is monitored by staff to ensure young people's safety. The windows are all double glazed with window locks, the front door and individual room doors can only be accessed with a key. All internal doors meet fire regulations and are fitted with door closures. Tudor House has smoke alarms in all rooms within the premises which are all electrically linked. Relationships With The Local Community: The dedicated PCSO for the area is Chloe- Rae Williams, Chloe has been working for the Constabulary for 5 years. The first 4 years were spent working in Custody Suites as a Detention Officer across the county before moving into Compass House when they opened in 2015. Chloe started her role as a PCSO in the summer of 2017 where she worked at Barton Street police station. Connections 2 Independence designated Safeguarding Lead is signed up to alerts with the local PSCO's and is notified of any concerns in the area. Connections 2 Independence has good relationships with the neighbours, they all have our office and duty phone numbers to enable them to contact if they have any concerns with disturbance and to share their feedback on the young people. 4. Positive Factors Of Location: Tudor House is located in an area that is close to a lot of facilities such as bus stops, supermarkets, GP Surgery and post office. Robinswood Hill is a short walk from the property which young people are encouraged to actively walk up to promote their healthy lifestyle. Staff will attend with young people to show them how to get there and different routes to the top. This also gives young people an opportunity to build their relationships with their house mates and staff who work for Connections 2 Independence. There is easy access to local schools and training providers which are walking distance away. As well as community projects such as the friendship café and the Cavern. Young People are allowed to attend these provisions as it is a safe place to meet and access help around health, benefits, immigration, education, careers and training. These groups are inclusive which bring together individuals from all backgrounds. Potential Risks in This Location to Young People Living at Tudor House (Include checks and information from Planning Services/Community Police) There is no known potential risk in Gloucester. However, each Young Person has their own personalised Risk Assessment, this is so we have an idea surround their risks. For Example: If a Young Person gravitates towards a certain area or is known to



drink alcohol. Then these risks are managed based on this. We have a list of where individuals may gravitate towards including, Low Level Intelligence of Local Drug Suppliers which is included on the Individual's Risk Assessment.

#### 6. Current local information from Public Protection

A Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) restrict certain behaviours in Gloucester which can ban people from behaving in a certain way.

Breaching a PSP in Gloucester can result in a £80 fine.

#### Current local stars on offending in the Linden area are:

- Miscellaneous violence (A broad category of violent offences including neglect, conspiring to cause harm and dangerous driving) 11

### Stronger Safer Gloucester Partnerships:

The Stronger Safer Gloucester Partnership (SSGP) is the strategic group bringing agencies together to work in partnership on the wider wellbeing, health and community safety agenda in the City of Gloucester.

Gloucester City has a history of strong and successful partnership working to drive forward positive changes in our communities and address issues affecting our residents. THE SSGP builds on this, bringing together the people who have the ability, resources and commitment to make things happen.

#### The Structure of Health in Gloucester:

With Gloucestershire being a two-tier authority the responsibility for public health sits with the County Council, under the Director of Public Health. Planning is delivered at the District Level, therefore forming and maintaining a good working relationship between Public Health and Planning team is considered an essential component of delivering meaningful change.

#### 9. Any issues with Local Schools Health Centres or Accessibility to Local Services

There are no issues with access to local schools or health centres. There are two secondary schools and two grammar schools within walking distances of Tudor House. Gloucester Health Access Centre is also in walking distance as well as training providers and other local services.

#### 10. Continency Planning

We have alternative accommodation that is available should there be an emergency, or the property is deemed as unsafe. This ensures that a move for a young person that may not be their own fault is a smooth transition and they are still supported in the same way. For an extreme situation that our emergency accommodation is unable then we have built connections with local B&B Owners, Air B&B Hosts and Hotels in the area, which then helps us should we be in a position of where we require emergency safe places to stay.
