

Knowsley Multi Agency Neglect Strategy 2024-27

Purpose and Aim

To reduce the prevalence and impact of child neglect across Knowsley through the provision of a joined up multi-agency response that improves outcomes for children.

The overall aim of this strategy is to improve the recognition of neglect in families; to improve Agencies' responses to these families; and to ultimately improve positive outcomes for children, and families.

What is Neglect?

Working Together to Safeguard Children 2023 defines neglect as:

'The persistent failure to meet a child's basic physical and/or psychological needs, likely to result in the serious impairment of the child's health or development. Neglect may occur. during pregnancy as a result of maternal substance abuse. Once a child is born, neglect may involve a parent or carer failing to:

- Provide adequate food, clothing and shelter (including exclusion from home or abandonment)
- Protect a child from physical and emotional harm or danger
- · Ensure adequate supervision (including the use of inadequate caregivers); or
- Ensure access to appropriate medical care or treatment.

It may also include neglect of, or unresponsiveness to, a child's basic emotional needs.

Priorities

Priority 1: Strong and effective leadership across all agencies reduce and respond to neglect.

Priority 2: Improve capability of multiagency workforce, to recognise, understand and identify the impact of neglect.

Priority 3: Evaluate our practice and continually improve its effectiveness so we can improve performance and reduce the neglect of children and young people.

How will we know we have made a difference?

- Measure the impact of training
- Undertake audit of Multi agency practice

- Monitor a multi-agency dataset
- Identify and share good practice.
- Scrutiny from the KSCP partnership

Outcomes for children and young people in Knowsley

- 1. Reduction in levels of neglect
- 2. Improved attendance at school
- 3. Reduction in re-referrals to Children's Social Care concerning neglect
- 4. Reduction in the number of children becoming looked after due to neglect.
- 5. Increase in neglect being addressed at the earliest opportunity through partnership Early Help.
- 6. Increased awareness of professionals in respect of the impact of neglect
- 7. The voice of child and their lived experience is listened to.
