

Homelessness and Homelessness

Advice and support for 16/17 year olds Are you worried about where you are going to live?

What will happen when I call Children's Services?

- You will speak to a social worker who will listen and ask questions to understand your housing situation better.
- The social worker will make a record of your discussion and document your views.
- The social worker will also speak to your parents/ carers to gather their views.
- If you are not able to return home, Children's Services will start a joint assessment with Housing.

Where will I go?

- Where possible we will always look at and prioritise options for you to remain living with your family/ friends whilst we assess your needs and understand your situation more.
- We work with a service called Family Assist who will also provide support to you and your parents/carers to understand the reasons you are homeless.
- If there are no family/friends who can help you with accommodation or if you cannot return home, we will arrange short-term accommodation.

 A social worker will explain the different long-term housing options available to you.

What are my longerterm options?

We know this is a worrying time so there will be support available through a **children's advocate**; they can help you to understand your options and ask questions on your behalf.













The different options available to you are:

Option 1

Becoming a looked after child

- If you become a Looked After Child you will receive ongoing support from Children's Services. This will include regular reviews overseen by an Independent Reviewing Officer to ensure you are getting the right support.
- You will either live with a foster carer or in a semi-independent placement.
- You may also be entitled to support from the leaving care team up to the age of 25 - you can find out more information on our local offer by following this link: www.lbhf. gov.uk/sites/default/files/section_ attachments/366_9ds_care_ leavers_offer_booklet-a5_rev1.pdf



 This is the most suitable option for most young people; if you do not wish to be looked after, you will be strongly encouraged to discuss your decision with the children's advocate.

Option 2

Supported housing

- If you decide you do not want to become a Looked After Child you will be offered supported accommodation through Housing via the Young Person's pathway (not temporary accommodation, B&B, Council accommodation etc).
- In most cases, based on your needs you will continue to be supported by a social worker until you turn 18.
