

Factors to consider at each visit

Continued from page 1

Staying Safe

Assess Support

16 – 19 yrs

Offer EHA, SC referral at 20/40 for unborn should safeguarding concerns be identified and refer pregnant young person if required (under 18 yrs)

Under age of 13 yrs

Considered statutory Rape.

Immediate Safeguarding referral to be made and notify Safeguarding midwives who will liaise with police and Social Care.

Under age of 16 yrs:

EHA to be offered. SC referral for UBB at 20/40 should safeguarding concerns be identified and consider SC referral for pregnant young person if required

Refer to Consultant <16yrs
Refer for anaesthetic review
PMHT (CAMHS if under 18)
QUIT 51
YEP course
Promote Children' Centres
Sexual Health/Contraception
Early HV AN contact

Being Healthy

Antenatal and Postnatal care.
Ensure appropriate care.
Follow Trust pathway

Consider EHA, EHW, YEP course, if available
If not in education consider referral to social care

Housing - offer EHA
Advise young person to access local housing support officer / County Council
