SLOUGH – THE TOWN

Slough is a very diverse, multi-cultural town which had a high street and two covered shopping precincts; Queensmere and The Observatory. There are many food stored selling produce from around the world to enable multi-cultural community to eat foods from their homeland. Slough is just off Junction 6 of the M4 Motorway and Reading is only around 23 miles west on the M4 and is famous as one of the UK's top ten retail destinations. Central London is about the same distance in the opposite direction. Windsor is only a few miles away with its many tourist attractions, Windsor Castle and the soldiers, River Thames and Eton College amongst them. There are good rail links as well with Reading and London Paddington being 20 and 15 minutes on the Great Western Line. Crossrail is in the process of being constructed which will run fast rail links between Reading and Essex. Slough used to have many employment opportunities predominantly in manual and semi-skilled work. This has now shifted in recent decades to high tech service and distribution sectors – O2 Telefonica, Ferrari Maserati and Blackberry which contribute to providing Slough with a solid economic base. There are various events that takes place yearly which include the bonfire and fireworks spectacular, annual canal festival, the Mela, Night of the Festivals, and continental markets in the town centre.

- Our children access local services during their stays at Breakaway, shops, leisure facility etc, and staff have always been understanding of the children's needs.
- There has not been any negative behaviour from members of the public towards the children
- Parents/carers are responsible for taking their child to GP, dentist, hospital appointments/to see specialists, opticians etc. However, in an emergency situation Breakaway do take children to the walk-in centre, A&E, call NHS Direct for advice, contact child's own GP for clarification of medication instructions etc. Staffs do attend meetings involving CAMHS if requested to be parents/ appropriate adult/carers, to offer support.

SAFEGUARDING CONCERNS	 Breakaway is located on a small complex with two other bungalows and a day centre (adults), all difficulties/disabilities, all staff working on the complex understand the needs of our children Outside of the complex we have no problems with our neighbours- there is a school adjacent to our boundary fence and on the odd occasion our children have thrown objects over the fence, the school are understanding and allow us to go and get them. There is St Andrew's Church and they have very kindly lent us tables and chairs for our fun days and we also use the church hall for our Christmas party. There is a small public house just outside of the complex but Breakaway has never suffered any noise disturbance from that area No through traffic 	 Small, busy car park.
