WHY TEAM-TEACH TRAINING?

Health and Safety legislation also requires employers to provide relevant training to reduce risk wherever it is foreseeable. Team-Teach training is designed to help employers who have a duty of care to fulfil that duty.

It provides the correct balance in reducing risk, restraint and restriction within a clear ethical framework.

TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

- The training room needs to be large enough to seat all course members around tables.
- We need two additional tables, one for the presenters and one for a book display.
- There must also be space for a screen and for the tutors to present.
- A separate cleared room or areas is required that is large enough to allow all the course members to stand apart with arms outstretched without touching. (as a rough guide 1 square metre per person)

- 6hr Foundation Course for low risk settings where physical interventions are not normally required.
- 12hr Basic Course for settings where there is a foreseeable risk that physical interventions may be required.
- Advanced Modules personal safety training for settings where additional risk is evident. Topics include: advanced holds and restraints including ground holds, objects used as weapons, and transport.
- 5 day Intermediate Tutor Course -qualifies employer tutors to train their employees in the 6 and 12 hr programmes. It also allows them to fulfil a vital role monitoring and supervising ongoing practice.
- 4 day Advanced Tutor Course provides an additional qualification to deliver advanced modular training and to monitor, record and report the use of advanced strategies.

All legal content and physical techniques have been risk assessed by leading national experts in the field.

EVIDENCE BASED

Research conducted by the University of Portsmouth in 2004 found that over 80% of Team-Teach course participants rated the trainer's knowledge, attention to safety, approach, organisation, preparation and encouragement of individuals as "excellent".

They reported increased levels of confidence following training and nearly all the respondents said they would recommend Team-Teach to colleagues.


RECOGNITION AND ACCREDITATION
